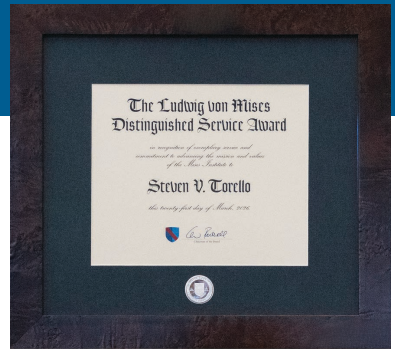
## TEACHING THE NEXT GENERATION

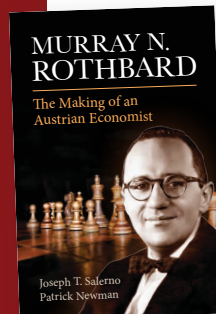

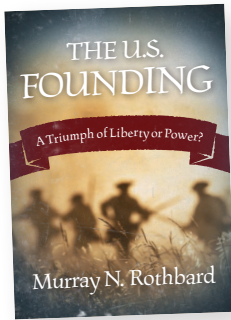

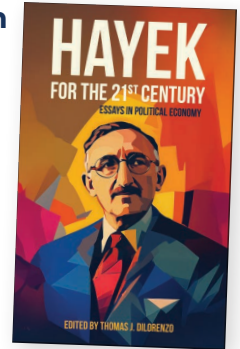

# WARD AND MASSEY LIBRARY ACQUISITION

In February, the Mises Institute had the once-in-a-lifetime privilege of acquiring a book from Carl Menger's private library.

Books from Menger's personal library are unheard of on the private market because his entire library is preserved at the Center for Historical Social Science Literature at Hitotsubashi University in Japan. Menger gave this book to his son, the mathematician Karl Menger, who was a professor at Illinois

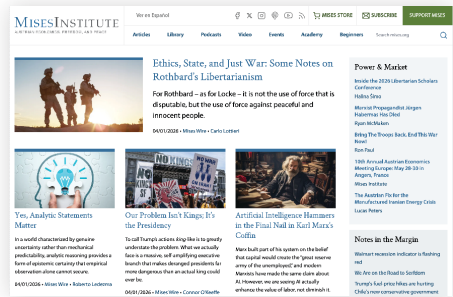
Institute of Technology from 1946 to 1971. The book resurfaced on the private market in the 1980s at a used bookstore in Chicago. The only reason this book is in private hands is because Carl Menger gave it to his son before donating his library.

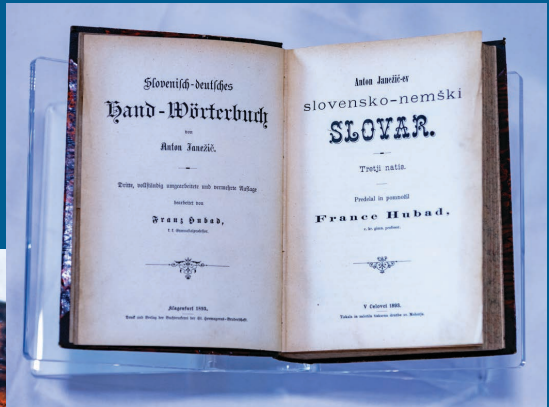
